Dear Mr. Gans:

Pursuant to Federal Rule of Appellate Procedure 28(j), Plaintiffs-Appellees respectfully submit this letter to inform the Court of significant developments.

On February 25, 2022, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) released new guidelines pertaining to mask use. Unlike the prior guidelines, which had been in effect throughout this litigation, the new guidelines do not include a blanket recommendation for universal indoor masking for all students, staff, teachers, and visitors to K-12 schools, regardless of vaccination status.

The new guidelines' recommendation for masking depends on a range of circumstances tailored to community risk. Iowa and Iowan school districts in this litigation have counties currently in all three community risk categories: low, medium, and high. The CDC recommends universal masking only where the risk category is high.

Notably, the updated recommendations reaffirm that layered prevention strategies, including masks, "can help prevent severe illness and reduce the potential for strain on the healthcare system."

The U.S. Department of Education also issued new guidance, stating in part: "To comply with their federal obligations, school districts must (among other things) make

reasonable modifications when necessary to ensure equal access for their students with disabilities Depending on the circumstances, a school district could decide that some degree of masking is necessary as a reasonable modification to ensure that students with disabilities have meaningful access to in-person schooling without incurring an elevated risk of hospitalization or death due to COVID-19. This is necessarily a fact-specific inquiry"²

The Eighth Circuit Panel remanded with directions "to allow the district court to enter a tailored injunction." *Arc of Iowa v. Reynolds*, 24 F.4th 1162, 1168 (8th Cir. 2022). In light of these changes, Plaintiffs believe the most appropriate course is, consistent with the Panel's guidance, for the *en banc* petition to be denied and the case to be remanded for the District Court to consider the scope of the injunction.
