VOTE BY MAIL IN IOWA

FOR THE NOVEMBER 2022 ELECTION

Election Day is Tuesday, November 8. Voting by mail is convenient and secure. It's as easy as 1-2-3!

Before you vote by mail, you have to be registered. If you recently moved from a different state or even a different address, you will have to register to vote or update your registration in Iowa. Unsure if you are properly registered? You can check online at *tinyurl.com/AmIRegisteredIA* or contact your local county auditor's office.

1 REQUEST A BALLOT

The first step is to fill out a form that asks for an "absentee" ballot to be mailed to you.

There is one printed on the back of this flier. County auditors begin accepting absentee ballot request forms after August 30. Drop off or mail this request form so that your county auditor receives it by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, October 24. Be sure to give it plenty of time to get there. If your ballot request form is not received in time, you are still able to vote inperson at the county auditor's office or in-person on election day at your polling place.

2 RECEIVE THE ACTUAL BALLOT IN THE MAIL Fill it out.

Follow the enclosed directions exactly and make sure to sign it properly.

3 RETURN THE BALLOT

You can mail it back to your county auditor's office or drop it off there in person.

To be counted, it must be received in the county auditor's office no later than 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, November 8. You can track the progress of your ballot at *tinyurl.com/trackballotIA*.

ABSENTEE BALLOT REQUEST FORM INSTRUCTIONS

A registered voter may make written application to their County Auditor for an absentee ballot starting 70 days before the election. A written application for a mailed absentee ballot must be received by the voter's County Auditor no later than 5:00 p.m. 15 days before the election.

In order to receive an absentee ballot, a registered voter **MUST** provide the following necessary information:

- 1. Name
- 2. Date of birth
- 3. Iowa residential address
- 4. Voter Verification Number (ID Number)
 - Iowa Driver's License or Non-Operator ID Number OR
 - Four digit Voter PIN located on the voter's lowa Voter ID Card
 - Any voter may request an Iowa Voter ID Card by contacting their County Auditor's Office
- 5. The name **OR** date of the election for which you are requesting an absentee ballot
- 6. Party affiliation only required for Primary Elections, which are held in even numbered years
- 7. Signature and date the form was completed

All voters are encouraged to provide their phone number and/or email address in the event their County Auditor needs to confirm any information on the request form.
